Please send papers you wish to have considered for publication to either the General Editor or the Associate Editor at the e-mail addresses given on the IPS website.

Please comply with the Society's style:

- Send your article, electronically, or on disk in MS-Word
- Include an abstract of no more than 100 words, including no logic symbols, no Greek and no abbreviations
- Everything in Garamond 12-point
- Single spaced
- With footnotes not endnotes
- Justified on both sides, including footnotes
- Using single quotation marks, except for 'quotes "within" quotes'
- With no quotation marks around an indented quote
- All such indentation should be left-indented only
- Where necessary, with single quotation marks as normal within the indented text
- Only one space following a full-stop, not two
- Never use underlining, always use *italics* instead
- The footnotes should contain the bibliography, which should *not* be a separate list
- Please do not use the author-date [Smith (1978)] system
- For other matters of referencing style, consult the MHRA Style Book, 5<sup>th</sup> edition (London: MHRA, 1996), chapters 11–12
- Place note references after punctuation
- Unless specifically required by a colloquial style, do not use 'don't,' 'hasn't' or 'isn't,' but 'do not,' 'has not' and 'is not'
- No full-stops after page, chapter or section-numbers in footnotes, unless followed or preceded by a sentence
