THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, 1875, SECTIONS 182-186. *Power to
 make
 Byelaws*

We, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the
 Borough of Wallsend, acting by the Council under
 the authority of the Commons Act, 1899, the Public
 Health Act, 1875, and of every other power enabling
 us in that behalf,

Do hereby make the following bye-laws for the
 regulation of the Wallsend Village Green:—

1. Throughout these bye-laws the expression
 "the Council," means the Mayor, Aldermen, and
 Burgesses of the Borough of Wallsend, acting by
 the Council, and the expression "the Village Green,"
 means the piece of land with the paths and roads
 thereon, commonly known as the Wallsend Village
 Green, situate in the Borough and Parish of
 Wallsend, in the County of Northumberland, and
 referred to as the Common in the scheme approved
 under the Commons Act, 1899, on the 28th day
 of December, 1906, by the Board of Agriculture
 and Fisheries.

2. A person shall not wilfully, carelessly, or negligently remove, or carelessly or negligently injure or deface any seat or fence, notice board, or any other thing put up or maintained by the Council on the Village Green.

3. A groom or other person shall not, without the consent of the Council or other lawful authority, exercise or break in any horse upon the Village Green.

4. A person shall not, without lawful authority, turn out, or permit to remain on the Village Green any cattle, sheep, or other animal. An officer of the Council may remove from the Village Green any cattle, sheep, or other animal being upon the Village Green in contravention of this bye-law.

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5. A person shall not, without lawful authority, draw upon the Village Green other than any road or cart-way on or across the same, any carriage, caravan, cart, truck, or other vehicle other than a wheeled chair drawn or propelled by hand, or a perambulator, chaise, mail cart, or other vehicle drawn or propelled by hand and used solely for the conveyance of a child or children. An officer of the Council may remove from the Village Green any vehicle drawn thereon in contravention of this bye-law.

6. A person, other than a person acting under the authority of the Council, shall not paint or post any bill, placard, advertisement, or notice upon any tree, or to or upon any fence or notice board on the Village Green.

7. A person shall not, without lawful authority, at any time take, dig, or cut any gravel, sand, sod, clay or turf, or other substance on or from the Village Green, or cut, fell, or carelessly or negligently injure any timber or other tree, brushwood, gorse, heather, shrub, or other plant growing thereon.

8. A person shall not wilfully, carelessly, or negligently soil or defile any part of any building, or of any fixed or moveable seat or post, or of any other structure or erection on the Village Green, or deposit any road sand, materials for repair of roads, dung, wood, rubbish, or other matter upon the Village Green.

9. A person shall not throw or discharge on the Village Green any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any person, or fire or discharge any firearm on the Village Green.

10. A person shall not climb any tree or any post on the Village Green.

11. A person shall not, without lawful authority, on the Village Green, take any bird's nest or egg, or catch any bird or lime any tree, or set any net or trap or lay any snare for any bird or other animal or shoot, course or chase game or other animals on the Village Green.

12. A person shall not light any fire on the Village Green.

13. (a) A person shall not except on such part or parts, if any, of the Village Green as shall have been set apart by the Council for the purpose, and as may be defined or described in a notice or notices which shall be affixed or set up in some conspicuous position on the Village Green play or take part (1) in any game of football, quoits, bowls, hockey, cricket, golf or (2) any other game which by reason of the rules or manner of playing or for the prevention of damage, danger or discomfort to any person on the Village Green may necessitate at any time during the continuance of the game the exclusive use by the player or players of any space in the Village Green.

(b) Every person resorting to any such part of the Village Green for the purpose of playing or taking part in any such game shall comply with the following regulations :—

(i.) He shall, in making preparation for the playing of such game and in the manner of playing, use reasonable and proper care to prevent undue interference with the reasonable and proper use of any space by any other person engaged in making preparation for playing or in playing therein, or thereafter resorting to such space for the purpose of making preparation for playing or of playing therein:

(ii.) He shall not at any time in any part of a space which is already occupied by other players begin to play without the permission of such other players:

(iii.) Except in any case where the exclusive use of any space may have been granted by the Council for the playing of any match, of which the occasion and character shall be such as to render expedient an extension of the time hereinafter specified, a player or company of players shall not, in making preparation for playing and in playing any game, use any part of such space for a longer time than *two hours* continuously, if at the expiration of that time any other player or company of players, for whose use no other part of the Village Green may be available, shall make known to such first-mentioned player, or company of players, an intention to use for the purpose of playing, such space as shall have been previously used by such player or company of players.

14. A person shall not, without the consent of the Council or other lawful authority, erect or permit to remain any post, railing, fence, tent, booth, stand, swing, building, shed or other structure, whether used in connection with the playing of games or not, on any part of the Village Green. Any officer of the Council may remove from the Village Green any structure erected thereon in contravention of this bye-law.

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15. A person shall not, on any part of the Village Green, beat, shake, sweep, brush, or cleanse any carpet, drugget, rug or mat, or any other fabric retaining dust or dirt.

16. A person shall not on any part of the Village Green, or any tree, bush, post, building, or structure thereon, hang, spread, or deposit any linen or other fabric for the purpose of drying or bleaching.

17. A person shall not on the Village Green use any indecent or obscene language to the annoyance of any person.

18. A person shall not wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Village Green, or hinder or obstruct any officer of the Council in the proper exercise of his duty under any of these bye-laws in relation to the Village Green.

19. A person shall not place on the Village Green any photographic cart or any show, exhibition, swing, roundabout, or other like thing. Any officer of the Council may remove from the Village Green anything placed upon the Village Green in contravention of this bye-law.

20. An officer of the Council may, after due warning, remove or exclude from the Village Green any person who, within his view, commits, or whom he reasonably suspects of committing, an offence against any of these bye-laws or against the Vagrancy Act 1824.

21. Every person who shall offend against any of the foregoing bye-laws shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of forty shillings:

Provided, nevertheless, that the Court of Summary Jurisdiction, before whom any proceedings may be taken in respect of any such offence may, if the Court think fit, adjudge the payment of any sum less than the full amount of the penalty imposed by this bye-law.

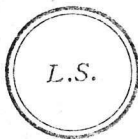
